LSBU's Response (In Blue)

This FOI request relates to the university's Confucius Institute, in particular to the roles at the Confucius Institute for which individuals are recruited in China (if I understand correctly, that is the Chinese language teachers, and the 'Chinese codirector').

- Are these university roles? Are the rights and privileges of university staff attached to these roles? Are those who occupy these roles staff of the university? Are these individuals employed by the university? Please share any documentation that answers these questions or otherwise defines the legal status of these roles and those who occupy them.
- Please state whether the university has received legal advice about the legal status of these roles and those who occupy them.

The teachers and co-directors are not employed by LSBU but are contracted and remunerated by the Chinese partner universities. They are put in the category of "contractor"/ "contingency worker," which entails a university email account and fixed-term staff card, allowing them to have access to limited services such as the library and printing and photocopying.
