

I refer to your request for information received on 17/07/23.

Freedom of Information Act 2000 - Request

Section 1 of the Freedom of Information Act (FoIA) places two duties on public authorities. Unless exemptions apply, the first duty at Sec1(1)a is to confirm or deny whether the information specified with a request is held. The second duty Sec 1(1)b is to disclose information that has been confirmed as being held. Where exemptions are relied upon section 17 requires that we provide the to applicant with a notice which: a) states that fact, b) specifies the exemption(s) in question and c) state (if that would not otherwise be apparent) why the exemption applies.

You had asked:

Q. Please provide a list of all financial interactions between the university and its subsidiary institutions and the Chinese Students and Scholars Association (CSSA). IE, please provide a list of funding provided to the CSSA.

Please provide the documentation from the last 10 years.

A. After making enquiries, I can confirm that there is no information held.

If you are dissatisfied with the response you have received, you may appeal in writing or by email to the University requesting a review. Correspondence should be sent to freedomofinformation@surrey.ac.uk.

On receipt of your appeal, arrangements will be made for a review of the original decision. You will be notified of the review decision in writing.
