The first students at the Jinan-Birmingham Joint Institute ("J-BJI") began each of the 4-year programmes during September 2017. Therefore, no students were eligible for graduation during the 2015/16, 2016/17, 2017/18, 2018/19, and 2019/20 academic years. Additionally, no information is available for the 2023/24 academic year as the students are not eligible for graduation until September 2024.


