The following explains some of the governance:

"A Joint Management Committee (JMC) shall be established in accordance with Applicable

Laws. The JMC shall be the governing body of the DII and will have ultimate decision making in relation to the DII.

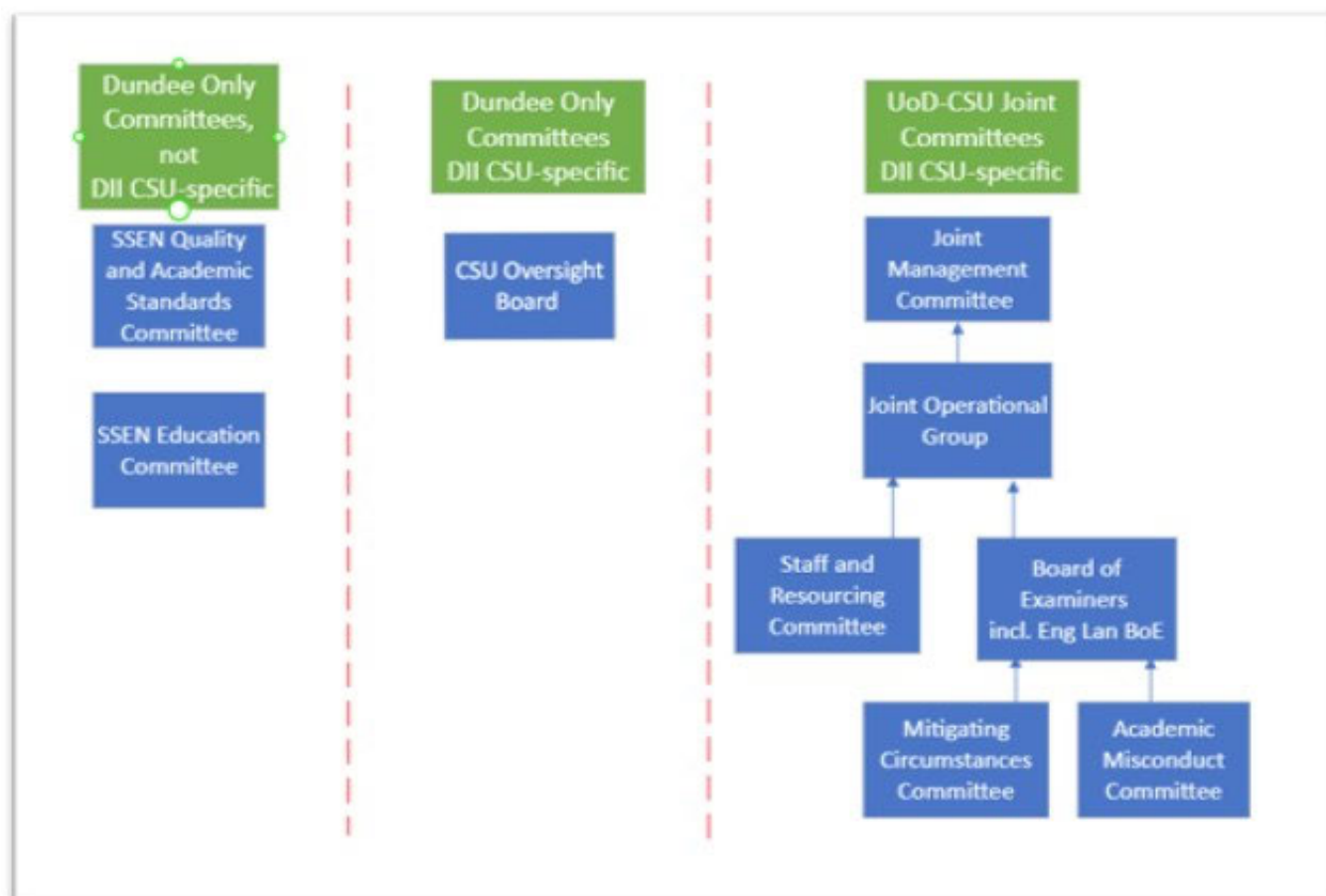
CSU and UoD shall each appoint a lead individual for the Collaboration (Dean from CSU and Vice Dean from UoD respectively).

A Joint Operational Group (JOG) shall be established in accordance with Applicable Laws. The JOG shall be responsible for the academic related administrative and operational matters relating to the DII.

A Joint Board of Examiners shall be established by the JOG..

A Staffing and Resourcing Committee will be established by the JOG.

UoD will appoint a member of staff to act as the "UoD subject Lead" and CSU will appoint a member of staff to act as the "CSU subject Lead" for each programme offered under the DII. Such individual subject Leads will take overall responsibility for the management and delivery of the relevant Programmes.



Each Party (i.e. UoD and CSU) shall apply the quality assurance and enhancement procedures as implemented at its respective home campus to the Programmes. The quality and standards of the Programmes will be consistent with the undergraduate programmes delivered at the Parties respective home campuses..... The full process of [Quality and Academic Standards that operates at UoD](#) will apply to the Programmes on the DII"

4. From 2015 to 2023, donations, grants, and research fundings received by the University of Dundee and its affiliated entities from the Central South University and/or any affiliated individuals, companies, or relevant Chinese official agencies.
