## G02119: Freedom of Information Request

We refer to your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the 'Act'), below. Please accept our apologies for the delay in responding to you.

We have received several requests similar (if not identical) to yours, including one (G02435) which is publicly available on the WhatDoTheyKnow web site at: <a href="https://www.whatdotheyknow.com/request/i\_am\_conducting\_a\_survey\_of\_uk\_h">https://www.whatdotheyknow.com/request/i\_am\_conducting\_a\_survey\_of\_uk\_h</a>.

That request (G02435, for "whether your university has ever had any contracts or business relationships with BGI Genomics or its UK subsidiary MGI Tech UK. If there has been any work undertaken by BGI Genomics with your university, please can you provide a list of these contracts with dates from and to, and a short description of what the contract was for") is identical to your request, and the University's response to G02435 was (excerpted) as follows:

In accordance with <u>Section 1(1)(a)</u> of the Act, we confirm that the University holds the information of the description specified in your request.

Information pertaining to the scope of your request, is exempt from disclosure by virtue of <u>Section 43(2)</u> of the Act, entitled Commercial Interests.

As Section 43(2) is a qualified exemption, the University has considered the <u>public</u> interest test.

If you do not feel that we have dealt with your request in accordance with the requirements of <a href="Part I">Part I</a> of the Act, you may request a review. Your request for a review must specify in what respect you consider that the requirements of <a href="Part I">Part I</a> of the Act have not been met; mere dissatisfaction with our response is insufficient. Please address your request for a review by completing the <a href="form">form</a> and selecting Fol Review.

In accordance with section 5.3 of the <u>Code of Practice</u>, a request for a review must sent within 40 working days of the date of this letter. The University is not obliged to accept any requests for a review beyond 40 working days. We will acknowledge your request for a review and endeavour to respond within 20 working days of its receipt but please note that a deadline for a review response is not prescribed by the Act.

The Information Commissioner is responsible for enforcing rights of access to information and the operation of the publication scheme. You may apply to the Information Commissioner in writing (FOI/EIR Complaints Resolution, Information Commissioner's Office, Wycliffe House, Water Lane, Wilmslow, Cheshire SK9 5AF) or <u>electronically</u> for a decision whether, in any specified respect, your request for information has been dealt with by the University in accordance with the requirements of <u>Part I</u> of the Act. The Information Commissioner will not normally act unless they are satisfied that the University's review procedure has been exhausted.

Please note that, although the University's response to G02435 did not contain hyperlinks, hyperlinks to <u>section 43(2)</u> and the <u>public interest test</u> have been inserted in the University's excerpted response, above.

As the two requests (G02435 and your own) are identical, the University's response to your request must perforce be the same [as the University's response to G02435, set out above).

If you do not feel that we have dealt with your request in accordance with the requirements of <u>Part I</u> of the Act, you may request a review. Your request for a review **must** specify in what respect you consider that the requirements of <u>Part I</u> of the Act have not been met; mere dissatisfaction with our response is insufficient.
